



PART A: Introduction to the BSc ASSESSMENT

- Part A mark does NOT contribute to BSc BUT:
- You must PASS (≥40%) to progress to the rest of the BSc

- Assessment will include one piece of written work, its type at the discretion of the BSc
- Note that Part A material WILL BE EXAMINED in the Part B exams
- Coursework mark may be used to allocate you to a project in the BSc

Part B: TAUGHT MODULES 1-3 ASSESSMENT

BSc VIVAS

DONE BY 9 APRIL 2012 AND BASED ON:

Your 5 submitted choices of BSc courses

Your rank = [Year 1 mark + 2 x Year 2 mark]

Number of places on each of the BSc courses

You will be e-mailed your BSc allocation in the week beginning 9 April 2012.

BMS – independent places on the courses

BSc APPEAL

You can appeal against your BSc allocation if:

You are unhappy with your original BSc allocation

or

You feel that you were mistaken in your original choice of BSc course

HOW TO APPEAL YOUR BSc ALLOCATION

- Apply after receipt of your BSc allocation
- Use the BSc Appeal form from the Year 3 teaching intranet
- Decision will be made after the Year 3 resits
- Decision will based on academic criteria and availability of place on the desired BSc

PART C ALLOCATION [MBBS]

BY 9 APRIL 2012 AND BASED ON:

Your 4 submitted Part C choices

Your rank = [Year 1 mark + 2 x Year 2 mark]

Number of places on the Part C options (Projects are not limited but specialist courses are)

You will be e-mailed your Part C allocation in the week beginning 9 April 2012.

BMS – independent system

HOW TO APPEAL YOUR PART C ALLOCATION

- Apply by a deadline in October 2012, after the start of the BSc
- Use the Part C Appeal form from the Year 4 teaching intranet
- Decision will be made a week after the submission deadline for the appeals
- Decision will based on academic criteria and availability of place on your desired Part C option (including BSc Project)

INTERCALATED BSc (EXTERNAL COURSE)

CAN APPLY IN YEAR 3

For BSc course not offered by the College

- To a Medical School of good standing
- After permission from the Head of Year 4 (BSc)
- Normally, you can seek permission by Jan/Feb of Year 3

INTERCALATED BSc (EXTERNAL COURSE)

ELIGIBILITY:

ABOVE AVERAGE ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE

- CLEAN STUDENT RECORD (no health issues that may affect performance in the external BSc)
- CLEAR JUSTIFICATION FOR CHOOSING THE EXTERNAL BSc COURSE

INTERCALATED BSc (EXTERNAL COURSE)

You will NOT lose your place at Imperial if you are unsuccessful in your application for intercalated BSc.

Your intercalated BSc degree will not be awarded by Imperial but by the medical school where you undertook the BSc.

- •APPLY IN YEAR 3 via e-mail to the BSc Curriculum Administrator by 4 May 2012
- **•SELECTION CRITERIA:**
- -PERFORMANCE IN PREVIOUS YEARS
- -STUDENT RECORD
- -INTERVIEW OF SHORT-LISTED CANDIDATES

McGill, CANADA EXCHANGE PROGRAMME

BSc PROJECT IN CANADA (10 WEEKS)

ONLY FOR BSc in Neuroscience and Mental Health

- •APPLY via e-mail to the BSc Curriculum Administrator by no later than end of September 2012
- **•SELECTION CRITERIA:**
- -PERFORMANCE IN PREVIOUS YEARS
- -STUDENT RECORD
- -INTERVIEW OF SHORT-LISTED CANDIDATES

MB/PhD (3 YEARS): after Year 4 (BSc)

Seek permission, usually from October of the BSc Year, to exit the MBBS course for 3 years from Dr Laki Buluwela, Faculty Academic Lead for Doctoral Programmes.

Eligibility criteria for the permission:

- Good 2i or 1st from the BSc
- Clean Student Record
- No more than 1 past exam re-sit
